Supervision and clinical education are integral parts of every graduate program in audiology and speech-language pathology. Supervisors and preceptors from the community offer invaluable guidance and support in helping graduate students to prepare for entry-level practice.

This workshop will explore the research and best practices in clinical education and supervision. Specific topics will include: role of supervisors and preceptors, the use of feedback and questions to guide student critical thinking, generational considerations, problem-solving for challenging situations, and the importance of collaboration in the supervisor/student relationship. The course is intended to support current or future supervisors and preceptors.
